





## **Key Dates**

Date	Description
March 12 - 20	Household will begin receiving official Census Bureau mail with detailed information on how to respond.
April 1	Census Day is observed nationwide. Once the invitation arrives, you should respond. When you respond, you'll tell the Census Bureau where you live as of April 1, 2020.
April	Census takers will begin visiting college students who live on campus, people living in senior centers, and others who live among large groups of people.
May - July	Census takers will begin visiting homes that haven't responded to the 2020 Census.
December	The Census Bureau will deliver apportionment counts to the President and Congress as required by law.
