

Overview of the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP)

- Known as The Nation's Report Card
- ➤ A common yardstick that measures and reports on the progress of education in the United States in a variety of subject areas
- Data for the nation, states, and select districts through the Trial Urban District Assessment (TUDA)
 - There are no school-level or student-level results



Overview of the National Assessment Governing Board

- An independent, nonpartisan board that sets policy for NAEP
- Responsible for NAEP activities, including
 - Assessment frameworks (blueprints)
 - Achievement levels (NAEP Basic, NAEP Proficient, and NAEP Advanced) for student performance
 - Assessment schedule
 - Releases



Overview of the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES)

- The nation's premier statistical agency for collecting, analyzing, and reporting statistics at all levels of education
- Oversees and implements key operations of NAEP, including
 - Assessment administration
 - Collecting and analyzing data
 - Embargoed briefings
 - Maintaining data credibility



How NAEP Results Are Reported






By Scale Scores

- NAEP results for grades 4 and 8 reading and mathematics are reported as average scores on scales of 0-500 points
- Scale scores can be used for comparisons over time, across jurisdictions, and among selected student groups

By Achievement Levels

NAEP Basic

Partial mastery of prerequisite knowledge and skills that are fundamental for performance at the NAEP Proficient level

NAEP Proficient

Solid academic performance for each NAEP assessment – Students reaching this level have demonstrated competency over challenging subject matter

NAEP Advanced

Superior performance beyond *NAEP Proficient*

NAEP Proficient achievement level does not represent grade level proficiency as determined by other assessment standards (e.g., state or district assessments)

Examples of Achievement Level Descriptions

	NAEP Basic	NAEP Proficient	NAEP Advanced	
	locate whole numbers on a number line	apply basic properties of operations to solve problems	understand and use inverse operations and use simple ratios	
Grade 8 Math	demonstrate understanding of scientific notation	solve problems involving capacity, area, and weight	reason abstractly using multiple steps of addition and subtraction in context	
Grade 4 Reading	sequence or categorize events from the story	provide a reason why a particular detail is important to the story	distinguish the theme of a text	
Grade 8 Reading	determine the meaning of words using context from one section of the text	provide a reasonable opinion supported by some evidence from the text	interpret descriptive or figurative language and how it impacts the meaning of the text	










2022 Saw Largest Math Declines



















Reading Scores Dropped in 2022







Embargoed Media Call Access

- NCES will reach out to reporters to offer embargoed access
- Journalists must agree that their news outlet will abide by the embargo's terms to receive access

Data will be available on a secure website starting the day of the embargoed media briefing, roughly 12 hours before the embargo lifts at 12:01 am



Avoiding "misNAEPery"

- Correlation is **not** causation
- > Do not collapse results across subjects and grades
- > Do not equate changes with an amount of time
- Results should not be numerically compared or ranked without considering statistical significance
- > "10 points = a grade level" is **not** a valid statement
- NAEP Proficient represents competency over challenging subject matter and does not align with most states' definitions for gradelevel performance
